WHEREAS, Resolution No. 213-14 of the Schuyler County Legislature dated June 9, 2014 requested the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) to make a final SEQR determination and issue Finger Lakes LPG Storage ("Finger Lakes") the requested permit, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 251-16 of the Schuyler County Legislature dated August 8, 2016 issued to NYSDEC the same request as Resolution No. 213 for the revised application which included the elimination of the butane storage reservoir, one brine pond and the rail and truck loading/unloading facilities, and

WHEREAS, Finger Lakes issued a May 17, 2018 letter to the Commissioner of NYSDEC in which the regulatory agency was notified that a recently developed solution mining well (well 64) by US Salt, may be in communication with either Gallery 10 and/or other nearby wells, and

WHEREAS, the draft permit issued by NYSDEC staff would require Finger Lakes to conduct a pressure test of Gallery 10 to ensure there is no connection with Gallery 1, as well as to identify whether other adjacent wells are in communication with Gallery 10.
