Drug-Free Communities Support Grant Application	<p>Discussion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Coalition discussed the end of the first 5-year DFC grant and whether the Coalition wished to apply for a second 5-year. There was also a discussion about who should be the fiscal agent and who should write the grant. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <u>Motion:</u> Ellie motioned for SCCUDD to apply for a second 5-year DFC grant. Mel seconded. All in favor. Motion approved. <p>Action Items</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Decide if Public Health will remain as the fiscal agent. Secure a grant writer.
Updates from membership	<p>Discussion</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Hillary shared that work continues on the Care Compass Network project to address the opioid epidemic in Schuyler, Steuben, and Chemung counties. A 0.5 full time equivalent Certified Recovery Peer Advocate continues to serve Schuyler County through this grant, meeting with clients in many different settings (in the clinic, out in the community, through referral, etc.). A total of 73 individuals have been supported while in recovery through this Peer Advocate so far (April-June). She also shared that the first meeting of the Regional Opioid Task Force through this project is scheduled for Thursday, July 26th in Corning. She shared that an inventory survey was conducted over the last month to assess the resources available within the three-county region. Survey results will be reviewed at this meeting to move forward with addressing the gaps and areas of opportunity identified. Sarah introduced Michelle, STTAC's new community engagement coordinator. She will be involved in SCCUDD's tobacco-related policy change efforts. Mel updated the group that Arnot Ogden now has a mandatory drug screening policy for giving birth. It was introduced in late April in response to Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS).
